For promotion to Chief Petty Officer and above, you must pick one of the following leadership essay prompts to respond to, read one of the books from Captain's reading list, and write a book report following the guidelines below (answer all four prompts for the book report). Ask your Platoon Chiefs and Platoon Commanders to look over your work to get critiques and advice.

Leadership Essay Prompts (**choose one**):

- 1. Leaders often have many strengths but also have weaknesses as well. Describe your three best leadership strengths and give at least one example that demonstrates each of your strengths. The point is to identify and show a clear awareness of your personal strengths.
- 2. A successful leader must be at his/her best when faced with great challenges. Leadership requires the ability to make a difference under difficult circumstances. With this in mind, describe in detail a situation in which you exhibited such leadership. What difference did you, your action, and your decisions make?
- 3. If given the opportunity to interview any person from history about his/her leadership philosophy, which would that person be? Why did you choose this person? What three key questions would you ask them? Why?
- 4. Discuss a leader who has had a significant impact on you. How did this person affect your life? How did this person influence the development of your personal leadership style?
